The White Greyhound of Richmond

Two-Ounce Silver Bullion Coin

Inspired by ancient symbols of power and identity, The Queen's Beasts Collection from The Royal Mint brings to life the ten imposing statues that guarded the entrance to Westminster Abbey at the coronation of Her Majesty The Queen in 1953.

The majestic White Greyhound of Richmond completes this line-up of royal protectors. A heraldic symbol associated with faithfulness and loyalty that originated with Edward III, it was used by Henry VII to express his Tudor and Lancastrian ancestry which denoted his right to rule.

Reverse

The greyhound descends to The Queen through Henry VII. His father, Edmund Tudor, First Earl of Richmond, was granted use of a version of the Royal Arms that included a white greyhound as a heraldic supporter by his half-brother Henry VI.

The secure, detailed chainmail background texture is a signature of this bullion collection.



In heraldry, the greyhound is a symbol of faithfulness and loyalty. The jewelled collar marks it out as a favoured member of a noble household.

Jody Clark also designed the fifth definitive portrait of Queen Elizabeth II that appears on the obverse of The Queen's Beasts coins.

Struck in 999.9 fine silver reflected in the coin's inscription.
